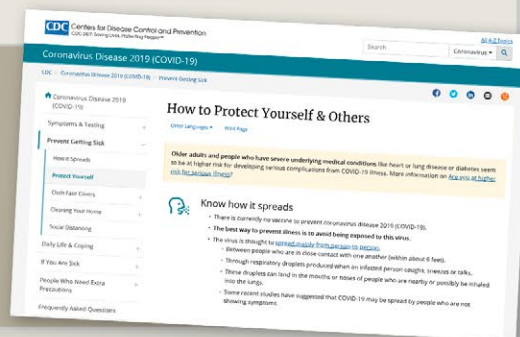

## MISHAP BRIEFS

### AMV

A 21-year-old Private First Class assigned to Fort Irwin, California, died in an Army motor vehicle mishap at the National Training Center during daylight hours. The Soldier was driving an M1113 HMMWV when he struck a winch cable that a Rotational Training Unit had stretched across the roadway to extricate an M978A4 fuel tanker with a Palletized Load System trailer carrying a modular fuel system. He was fatally injured and the truck commander was medically evacuated with non-life-threatening injuries.

Since FY16, the Army has lost an average of 12 Soldiers a year to AMV mishaps. Remember, risk management is most effective when it's dynamic and adapts to changes in mission and environment.
