MISHAP BRIEFS

POW

A Specialist assigned to Fort Hood, Texas, died in a privately owned weapons mishap in Killeen, Texas, at 2130 local. The Soldier was reportedly showing his shotgun to two other Soldiers at an off-post residence and pointed it at himself in a joking manner. One of the Soldiers told him that he shouldn't do that with the weapon. After stating that the shotgun was on safe, it discharged unintentionally, striking the Soldier. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

Since FY16, the Army has lost an average of four Soldiers a year to POW mishaps. This tragedy was the second fatal off-duty POW mishap of FY21.

POST THIS

KEEP IT CLEAN!

PATRONS MUST CLEAN EQUIPMENT SURFACES IN DIRECT CONTACT WITH THE SKIN OR BODY AFTER USE. SURFACES INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO —

- 1 Hand grips on cardio equipment such as treadmills, bicycles and ellipticals.
- 2 Hand grips on dumbbells, weight bars and other strength-training systems.
- 3 Pads/cushioned components such as fitness mats, bike seats, lifting benches and other cushioned components of strength training machines.
- 4 Fitness balls, rope handles and other fitness accessories.

* Check with military physical fitness centers for providing appropriate U.S. Environmental Protection Agency-registered antimicrobial sprays or wipes to clean equipment after personal use.
