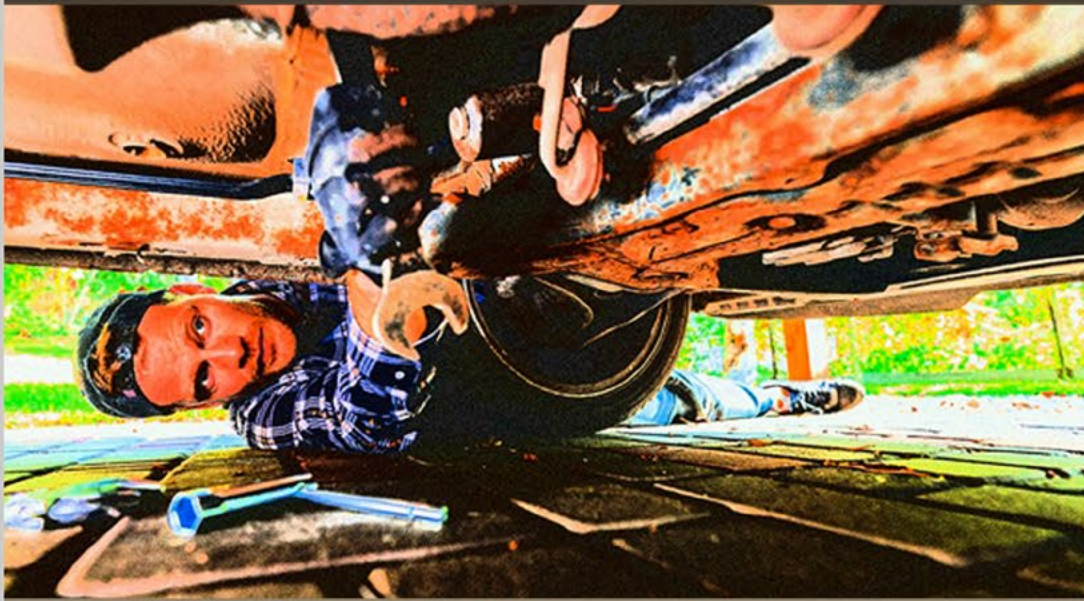

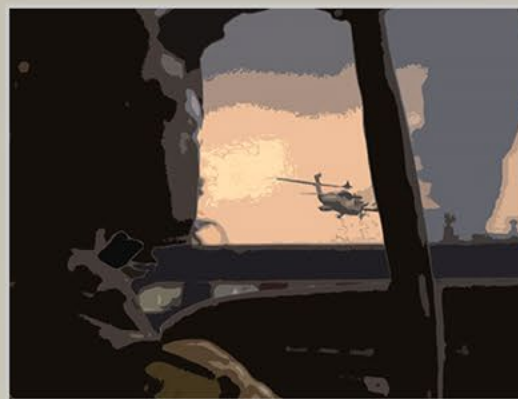
PMV MAINTENANCE

MISHAP BRIEFS

GMV

A Staff Sergeant assigned to Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, died in a government motor vehicle (GMV) mishap near Camp Buehring, Kuwait, at 0800 local. The Soldier was the front-seat passenger in an approved non-tactical vehicle traveling from Camp Buehring to Camp Arifjan when it was involved in a mishap that resulted in a rollover. The driver and rear passenger were evaluated at a local hospital for minor injuries. Initial indications were all occupants were wearing seat belts and speed was a factor.

SUVs have a more difficult time going around curves or handling sudden driving moves than smaller cars, so being mindful of your speed will go a long way in protecting yourself and your passengers.
